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### **President's Annual Report by Justin Falardeau**

First off, I would like to express my thanks and gratitude to the rest of the BCFPA executive for all of their hard work this year. While I carried the title of President, it was they that took care of the heavy lifting, and made things happen in the background. I would also like to thank **Stephanie Nadya** for being such a great mentor in her Past-President role.

We closed out the 2020 year with 75 active members. This breaks down as 41 regular members, 17 student members, 8 special/retired members, and 9 sustaining members. This is a drop from 85 members in 2019.

Financially, we posted a loss this year, but this deficit was reduced compared to recent years. This year's deficit can partially be attributed to our virtual speaker events, which were provided free of charge to our members. Please see **Simon Cowell's** Treasurer Report below.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, which came in to place early in the year, our regular BCFPA events were moved to a virtual format. While this change reduced the networking opportunities typically associated with our events, it also provided an opportunity to increase the geographic span of our audience and expand our pool of potential speakers. Without incurring travel costs, we had speakers from Cornell University, and 3M in London, Ontario. We also had attendees from as far away as Nova Scotia, who even ended up becoming members! Special thanks to **David Mahoney** for taking care of all the technical aspects of setting up the webinars, and also thank you to **Ivy Li, Simon Cowell**, and **Claire Nolan** for recruiting our speakers.

One of the commitments of the BCFPA is to support students. This year, our student coordinator, **Ivy Li**, organized a virtual student event in lieu of our annual Student Networking Event typically held in early October. The event brought together a number of Food Safety Professionals, who were able to answer questions from the students in attendance. We are also proud to be presenting two scholarships to deserving students: Yuritzel Moreno-Parra (1<sup>st</sup> place) and Shannon Stainsby (2<sup>nd</sup> place). Special thanks to **Stephanie Chiu**, our awards committee chair, for her work in organising this year's scholarship competition.

This year also saw an effort to improve communication with our members. In addition to our regular newsletter, our communications coordinator **Stephanie Chiu** also took the time to redesign our website, making it easier for our members to navigate. ### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm.

### 2. AGM Reports

The 2019 Annual Report was electronically distributed to members prior to the AGM. ### 6. Ratification of By-Law article amendment

Justin Falardeau presented the By-Law with the proposed amendment:

Article I section A-2-C: "Student members, with the exception of the appointed Student Coordinator, may not hold office in BCFPA, but may serve on committees and as appointed representatives of BCFPA."

Change to "Students members may sit on the Executive Board, but may not constitute more than two (2) Officers, nor represent more than half of the total number of Directors."

Among all the 18 attended voting members, 13 voted "Yes - I approve the amendments", zero voted "No - I reject the amendments", and 5 abstained from the voting. According to the By-Law, Article VI-B, the amendments has been approved since the affirmative vote number exceeded the two-thirds of the total presented voting members.

7. Scholarship and Award Presentation

Justin Falardeau presented the first-place and second place certificates and cheques to the 2019 student scholarship award recipients, Thomas Brenner and Alejandro Leiva Arrieta, respectively.

8. Next Meeting

Next AGM will be held at the call of the chair in January 2021.

Justin Falardeau closed the meeting by thanking the speakers, BCFPA Members and Sustaining Members for their continuing support of BCFPA activities.

### Student Networking Event - September 28th, 2020

In this unprecedent pandemic time, BCFPA held the annual student networking event online on September 28th. Thirty-five UBC and BCIT students and four guest speakers from Sani Marc, UBC, and government agencies, attended the Virtual Student Career Networking Event. The networking event was held as a roundtable discussion that aim to answer students' questions regarding their career and academic path. Justin Falardeau, BCFPA President and Ph.D. candidate at the University of British Columbia, opened the event with a heartwarming welcoming remark and an introduction of BCFPA Student Development and Professional Group. The panelists, Siyun Wang from UBC, Karen Fong from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, Claire Nolan from Sani Marc, and Alex Montgomery from CFIA, briefly shared their career journey to students. Following the opening session, the panelists answered students' questions collected from the pre-event survey, including their concerns about the job seeking process, self-development plan, and the requirements of different jobs in industry, government, and academia.
